- \* Always traveling- never time for a visit.
- \* Always have excuse for no visit.
- \* Sob stories- usually use this for financial gain, false emotional bond.
- \* Deployed in military.
- \* Vague details but professes love quickly.

## How to avoid being a victim of Catfishing.

With many people online dating sites, activity apps or social media, the following are some good rules to follow:

- \* Protect your data- don't give out to much information too quickly.
- \* Meeting in person- if the other person won't use webcams, such as, Skype, Facetime, that should send up a red flag. If you do meet- always meet in a public place and never your home.
- \* Don't sext with strangers or send risqué photos of yourself you never know where they will end up.
- \* Ask questions- if someone is pursuing another online, each person has the right to ask questions to make themselves feel comfortable and safe.
- \* Gut Check- It's as simple as that. If things just don't add up and your gut is saying something is off, it probably is. Don't let desperation of wanting a relationship block your common sense.
- \* Tell someone you trust- Running situations by a third party generally helps.
